Friday 20 February


OUR 2026 SNOWDROP SPECIAL : Banbury and Thenford

A carpet of shining white snowdrops is always a welcome sight to herald the beginning of spring. At **Thenford** **Lord and Lady Heseltine** have created a garden of major importance and the display of snowdrops is outstanding. With over 600 varieties visitors can be sure of a delightful walk through these beautiful gardens. We will also visit the historic market town of **Banbury** with its charming old streets, historic buildings, interesting little shops and peaceful canal. Two of its pubs are 500 years old. You will be able to obtain lunch or a pint in one of them if you wish.

Sunday 8 March

Daffodils at Leeds Castle or Sunday roast in Lenham, Kent

The first sight of Leeds Castle surrounded by its shining moat is a memorable experience but the addition of carpets of daffodils make it even more special. From Norman times it was home to several monarchs and in the 20th century it became an elegant country retreat visited by many famous people including Sir Winston Churchill, Charlie Chaplin and John F. Kennedy. As an alternative you may prefer a Sunday roast lunch at The Red Lion, a traditional inn, in the quaint medieval village of Lenham. Our previous lunches here have been very good.

Saturday 11 April

The Mary Rose and HMS Victory at Portsmouth or free time at the shops

With its long naval history Portsmouth is well worth a visit with attractions such as the Spinnaker Tower with its superb views and Gunwharf Quay shops. Or you may prefer to explore the Dockyard and visit the **Mary Rose**, King Henry VIII's Tudor warship which sank in the solent in 1545 and following its recovery is now displayed in the fine museum next door to Nelson's flagship HMS Victory. The dockyard entry fee covers all of its attractions as well as a harbour cruise and the Submarine Museum at Gosport.

Sunday 19 April

Exbury Gardens in the New Forest

A visit to the world famous Exbury Gardens is always a treat and in the spring the gardens are ablaze with magnolias, camellias, early rhododendrons and azaleas. There are riverside walks and a restaurant which serves meals with local produce. You may like to travel on the little steam train which winds through the gardens.


Malvern


Bournemouth & Compton Acres




Ironbridge or Sunday Roast pub lunch


Cotswold Wildlife Park or Sezincote and Chipping Campden




Saturday 29 August

Brighton for the finish of the London to Brighton Veteran Car Rally



Lavenham and the best of Suffolk

Tuesday 31 March 2026 for 3 days

Suffolk is a county rich in beautiful unspoilt villages and this springtime short break will feature some of the loveliest. We shall stay for 2 nights in the charming and picturesque village of **Lavenham** which has a wealth of colourful timber framed buildings. We shall be staying at the famous 4-star **Swan Hotel** which dates from the 15th century and has all the charm of a timber framed building. The bedrooms are traditional in style and well appointed whilst the hotel's attractive lounges have plenty of cosy corners in which you can enjoy a drink and relax. As for the programme of visits this will remind us of the artistic genius of both **John Constable** and **Thomas Gainsborough**. We also hope to see inside England's only Regency playhouse when we visit **Bury St Edmunds** - this will be subject to rehearsals or get-ins not taking place. There will also be the added bonus of springtime daffodils wherever we go.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Tuesday) We shall depart West London (Acton, Ealing, Greenford, Northolt, Hillingdon etc) and travel north eastwards into Essex. Following a break for coffee in **Brentwood** we shall travel to the area on the Essex / Suffolk border that John Constable featured in many of his paintings. A visit to the church at **Dedham** will be followed by **Flatford Mill** on the River Stour at **East Bergholt**. You will be able to obtain a light lunch here in the National Trust tea room. Finally we shall travel to **Lavenham** where we plan to check in at the **Swan Hotel** at about 4.45pm. **Dinner** here this evening.


Day 2 (Wednesday) After breakfast you will have time to explore charming **Lavenham at leisure**. The interesting Guildhall dates from 1592 and the Grade 1 parish church built in 1529 was paid for by the town's wealthy wool merchants and is a beautiful building. This afternoon we shall take you to nearby **Sudbury** where we shall visit the artist **Gainsbrough's House**. **Dinner** at the Swan Hotel this evening.

Day 3 (Thursday) Our final day will see us visiting **Long Melford** and passing through **Clare** and **Cavendish** prior to us arriving in **Bury St Edmunds**. Here we are hoping to visit the stunningly beautiful Grade 1 listed **Theatre Royal** which was designed by William Wilkins, architect of London's National Gallery. Before we leave **Bury St Edmunds** there will be time for you to obtain some lunch and also visit the cathedral and the colourful abbey gardens if you wish. **Dinner** awaits us this evening at 6.30pm at **Da Remo's** in Denham Village. Traffic permitting we expect to be back in West London by 8.30pm at Hillingdon, and slightly later at our other set-down points.




The old world charm of the Cinque Ports

Wednesday 29 April 2026 for 3 days

Coach supplied by Bessway Travel Ltd of North Wembley

One of the prestigious appointments held by the late Queen Mother was that of Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports and her official residence was **Walmer Castle** overlooking the sea at Deal in Kent. This ancient Tudor fortress has been transformed through the centuries into an elegant stately home and every year the Queen Mother enjoyed staying here. Some of the rooms she used are now open to visitors at this English Heritage property. The gardens here are very fine as are the celebrated gardens at **Great Dixter** near Northiam which we shall also visit. This short break has other delights not least the medieval hilltop town of **Rye**, **Royal Tunbridge Wells**, **Sandwich** and **Smallhythe Place** once the home of the acclaimed actress Dame Ellen Terry, the great aunt of Sir John Gielgud. We shall be staying for 2 nights near Rye at the **Flackley Ash Hotel** which offers very high standards and a touch of luxury.

ITINERARY

Day 1 (Wednesday) We shall depart West London (Acton, Ealing, Greenford, Northolt, Hillingdon etc) and travel south eastwards into Kent. Following a break for coffee we shall take you to **Royal Tunbridge Wells** where you will be able to visit **the Pantiles**, a Georgian colonnade with shops, and the ornate **Opera House**. The latter is now a Wetherspoons but operatic performances still take place here once a year. You could obtain lunch here if you wish. Then via the scenic Weald of Kent and its charming villages to **Smallhythe Place** near Tenterden, formerly the home of the celebrated actress **Dame Ellen Terry**. The house is full of her possessions including costumes she wore on stage. **Dinner** and a 2-night stay at the **Flackley Ash Hotel** near Rye.


Day 2 (Thursday) After breakfast we shall drive towards Romney Marsh to experience the unusual landscape of **Dungeness (coffee stop)**. Later we shall pass through Hythe with its sea views to arrive at medieval **Sandwich** and then **Walmer Castle** (English Heritage) at Deal. The Warden of the Cinque Ports has an apartment here - previous occupants include the Duke of Wellington and Sir Winston Churchill. **Dinner** at the Flackley Ash Hotel.

Day 3 (Friday) Our final day will see us travelling to the charming hilltop town of **Rye**. You will have time here at leisure to explore its quaint narrow streets, visit the church if you wish and obtain a light lunch in one of its cafes or ancient pubs. Afternoon visit to **Great Dixter**, one of England's finest privately owned gardens, made famous by Christopher Lloyd. Finally today we shall have **Dinner** at 6.30pm at **Da Remo's in Denham Village**. Subsequently our Bessway coach will rendezvous at Hillingdon Station with 7-seater licensed cars, one of which will take you home if you have booked our home pick-up service. Otherwise our coach will set down in Yeading, Northolt, Greenford, Hanwell, Ealing, Acton and Perivale to conclude our tour.



Of all the islands around Britain, the Isle of Wight is one of the most interesting to visit with its mild climate, historic houses, pretty villages and wealth of wildlife including red squirrels and white tailed eagles. This afternoon we shall pass through **Freshwater** before arriving at **Yarmouth** where there will be time to explore this attractive town with its wealth of old buildings. **Dinner** at our hotel.







Day 4 (Monday) Our final day will see us taking a morning drive through Sandown to Bembridge and Brading before we stop at the **Donkey Sanctuary**. Then via Godshill to the historic **Carisbrooke Castle** where Charles I was held prisoner during the Civil War. Finally we shall return to Southampton in the mid afternoon aboard the Red Funnel ferry. At 6.00pm **Dinner** awaits us at the impressive **Tyley Hall Hotel** near Hook in Hampshire.




Lumley Castle




Durham



Before submitting a booking for a day trip, short break, holiday or other event you are required to read these conditions and be aware of them as they are legally binding on the person making the booking and on any other persons included in that booking.
2. Bookings are accepted subject to availability. Early booking is strongly recommended to avoid disappointment.
3. Persons with special needs are required to make these known at the time of booking. Wheelchairs of the folding type can be accepted on trips but the company needs to be told in advance if persons are bringing one. Motorised vehicles cannot be accepted as they tend to be very heavy. Coach drivers cannot be asked to lift them into the coach boot because of their excessive weight.
4. You must be ready to depart at the departure time that has been given to you. If you are not ready at this time the tour manager is authorised not to wait for you in fairness to other passengers. The same rule applies to the homeward journey and to intermediate stops. We advise you to be ready to depart 5 minutes ahead of the time you have been given.
5. You may not play a CD, DVD or MP3 player or radio on the vehicle unless you use headphones and its operation is totally silent. Nor is smoking allowed on vehicles. This is illegal. Nor must hot meals or hot snacks be consumed.
6. Seat belts must be fastened at all times when the vehicle is moving. This is a legal requirement.
7. If you need to cancel a booking you have made please notify the booking office immediately. Refunds are not allowed but you can transfer your place(s) to other person(s) if you wish but their names must be supplied in advance.
8. The company reserves the right to cancel a trip, short break or holiday if insufficient bookings are received to make it financially viable. In this event a full refund of monies paid will be made. No compensation can be paid in respect of disappointment, inconvenience or consequential financial loss.
9. The company cannot accept responsibility for passengers' possessions that are left on vehicles. Anything left on a vehicle will always be at the owner's risk.
10. The company reserves the right to terminate a passenger's trip, short break or holiday in the event of any unreasonable conduct which, in its opinion, is likely to cause distress, damage, danger or annoyance to our other passengers. Upon such refusal or termination the company's responsibility for that trip, short break or holiday ceases. The company will be under no obligation whatsoever for any refund, compensation or loss that may be incurred as a result. If buying goods abroad then duty free allowances must not be exceeded. Nor must passengers ask other passengers to carry goods for them through customs. On overseas trips a valid passport and proof of travel insurance must be carried at all times.
11. Coach Trips from London Ltd is not a vehicle owner or operator. Vehicles used are hired from licensed private hire operators who are well established in this type of activity.
12. Please take care at all times when boarding and alighting from vehicles, and when crossing roads as this is sometimes necessary. Similarly, when entering buildings and negotiating steps, stairways and corridors. The company does not accept responsibility for accidents unless the company is proven to be negligent.
13. If you have a complaint regarding the execution of a day trip, short break or holiday please submit details of your complaint in writing to Graham Jenkins, the company's administrator and director, at 2 Wood End Gardens, Northolt, UB5 4QH within 10 days. Please note that the company cannot accept responsibility for any situation which is outside of its direct control, such as traffic congestion, closed roads or industrial action unless the company is proven to be negligent. No liability is accepted for delays caused by circumstances beyond the company's control. If a day trip is abandoned because it is impossible to reach the intended destination due to gridlocked roads, closed roads or severe delays at ferry ports then passengers would be returned to their departure points and the excursion re-run free of charge at a later date. The decision to abandon a trip would be taken by the company and this decision must be respected by the passengers affected.
